HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Ekiti State, in south west Nigeria was created in 1996. Some of the daunting issues confronting the new state then were issues around environment degradation, poor community health, falling standard of education, security of lives and properties and poverty, among others. These overwhelming challenges made the state government appeal for private participation in tackling the challenges for better society. It was as a result of this that, Environmental Development and Family Health Organization (EDFHO) was established in Ekiti state in 1998 and registered as non- governmental organization in year 2004 with corporate Affairs Commission. Today the organization is firmly established in four geopolitical zones of Nigeria with five state offices and its National head office in Ado- Ekiti, Ekiti state.

EDFHO was established to promote social-economic development of the less privilege through an improve poverty alleviation programme in Nigeria by providing its target groups (women, children, youths and artisans) with capacity to protect the environment, provide effective health services and economic empowerment for sustainable development. In order to achieve this, EDFHO adopted poverty reduction integrated programming which includes: Reproductive health, HIV / AIDS, Child and Maternal health; Environment, Water, Sanitation and Hygiene promotion; Micro-credit for cooperative Agriculture and Enterprises development scheme for youths and women empowerment; and Mentorship, Capacity building and consultancy services

GOAL: Promote social-economic development of less privilege through an improve poverty alleviation programmes in Nigeria.



PREVIOUS PERFORMANCE/EXPERIENCE IN PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION

(A) **REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH AND HIV/AIDS:**

The unit programmes have been support by series of Donors which include the following:

FHI – USAID, AAI, PATHS, DFID, EKITI SACA/WORLDBANK, KOGI SACA/WORLD BANK, Hope world wide / MTNF, PACT-Nigeria, C-Change/FHI360,MSH, ONDO SACA/WORLD BANK.

HIV/AIDS PREVENTION AND CONTROL:- **EDFHO** is specifically into Awareness creation on the prevention of HIV/AIDS among its target groups in its states of operation in Nigeria, i.e. –In-school Youth, out-of-school Youth and General population. Some activities implemented under the HIV/AIDS programme include:

(1) Activities:- Between April 1999 and March, 2004, EDFHO collaborated with Family Health International (FHI) with funding from United States Agency for International Development (USAID), to carry out series of activities with In-school Youths Ekiti and Ondo States under a project title: "HIV/AIDS/STIs intervention with in-school youths in Ekiti and Ondo States".

The HIV/AIDS prevention activities of EDFHO led to the formation of support and care programme for people living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHAs) and development of OVC programmes in Ekiti and Kogi States.

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS.

- Enrolled and served 4060 vulnerable children.
- > Served 1073 care givers from 1399 households.
- ➤ 2022 OVC were provided with registration birth certificates.
- ➤ 22 OVC were provided with shelters.
- ➤ 12 SILC groups and 22 C-IYFE groups formed.
- ➤ 207 Care givers accessed cash transfer for economic empowerment.
- ➤ 140 older OVC were provided with vocational skills in tailoring, Mechanic, vulgarizer, confectionaries, etc.

- > 835 households benefitted from vitamin A cassava production.
- ➤ 845 provided with orange seedling and other economic trees.

EDFHO CHARITY SHOP

To meet up with our charity obligation in the face of dwindling international funding support, EDFHO incorporated a social marketing strategy that have direct impact on sustainable development, all proceeds from the marketing is channeled back into EDFHO charity activities to limit dependency on foreign assistance. As a step towards improving funds available for charity activities, protect the environment and re – distribute materials in a way that benefits the society, EDFHO operates a CHARITY SHOP.

The charity shop raises fund for EDFHO's 'Keep A Child in School' Project and also make possible for the very low income earner quality and affordable materials which they might not be able to afford in the open market.

Some of the benefits of the shop include:

- Environmental benefits: new resources are not used in the creation of goods and selling second-hand goods saves the environment.
- **Budget shopping**: the charity shop will be a dependable source of good quality items at low prices.
- **Volunteering opportunities**: Youths will be given the opportunity to volunteer in the stores where they can learn new skills, build team spirit, and make new friends as they gain work experience.

To get quality materials for shoppers, we appeal to the public to donate their unwanted or unused materials (Cloths, Shoes, Bags, Electronics, Books, Toys, etc) that might still be of use to other people.

The shop is supported in the following ways:

- **Donating**: Individuals and establishment supports the shop by donating items to the shop.
- **Buying**: People who buys from charity shops also contributes since such money goes directly into our charity activities.
- **Volunteering**: Individuals or groups could also contribute by volunteering in the shop (activities in the shop include sorting, packaging, house to house pickups, mending, etc).

Achievements:-

- Six Children have been selected with four of the currently on Scholarship in Ondo State with Funds Generated from the Shop
- ➤ Over 3 Tons of household materials (Cloths, bags, electronics etc) have been collected nd redistributed to low income earners in Ondo State thereby encouraging recycling and reducing materials going into dumpsites.

HEALTH SAVINGS FUND

Experiences have shown that, the poor are unable to have adequate, proper and timely health care services during illness. To avert this ugly situation, which has led to the death of many of the rural populace especially women, **EDFHO** therefore developed a compulsory health savings fund. Where every **EDFHO** member and working Individuals / Cooperative societies are made to save a specified amount of money compulsorily into the Health savings fund.

During illness, the members using their savings as collateral can apply for "Health recovery loan" for medical treatment. This loan which will also be guaranteed by a principal member of the family (husband or wife) and will be repaid without interest if the beneficiaries pay back on or before three months, but if not the loan will bear interest of normal micro-credit scheme loan.

In a situation where members do not obtain loan and have fully paid all savings for ten years, the member can draw his/her savings with agreed interest to pursue or establish an income generating activities.

(B) ENVIRONMENT WATER SANITATION, AND HYGIENE PROMOTION AND HEALTH EDUCATION AND ENLIGHTENMENT CAMPAIGN PROGRAMME.

The programme have so far been supported by UUICEF, UNDP, WaterAid, Society for Family Health (SFH), PATHS – DFID, SLGP – DFID and EU-INSIDE etc.

- 28 volunteers trained as sanitation and hygiene promoters
- 54 teachers and students leaders trained on environmental Health Clubs management

- 15 community based artisans trained on operation and maintenance of boreholes facilities
- 8 communities trained on community lead total sanitation (CLTS)
- 5 boreholes drilled and installed in 5 communities for safe water supply

(C) MICRO-CREDIT (REVOLVING LOAN SCHEME) COOPERATIVE, AGRICULTURE AND ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT: SCHEME – DFID, NAPEP, MOWA/FA, EKITI MICRO-CREDIT AGENCY.

The micro-credit/ cooperative and Enterprises Development scheme of the organization is aimed to create employment for economically and socially disadvantaged groups (especially women and Youths) through income generating activities and skills / capacity acquisition and income generating activities for members cooperative groups and individual entrepreneur and people infected and affected by HIV/AIDS. This scheme have so far supported by DFID, NAPEP, BOA, Federal and State Ministry of Women Affairs, Ekiti State Micro-credit Agency etc.

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS:

To date, the organization have been able to mobilize and facilitate the formation of over 50 cooperative societies of which 80% are women cooperatives groups.

Building the capacity of cooperative societies and individual entrepreneurs. (Trainings) in Business management, cooperative and leadership skill, Record keeping etc.

(D) MENTORSHIP, CAPACITY BUILDING AND CONSULTANCY SERVICES

When EDFHO was established in 1998, it was the only developmental NGO in the state, the members of the organization saw the challenge of not be able to face the challenges on ground alone, therefore decided to encourage the formation of new CBOs/NGOs and provide mentorship. As at today, EDFHO have assisted in the formation of over ten (10) new CBOs/NGOs and provided mentorship to the level of receiving donor funding of which over five (5) had or currently implementing donors funded projects. EDFHO is looking for the day it will secure grant and start disbursing grant directly to them and other NGOs. In other to be able perform the role effectively, members and staffs of the organization are well equipped to offer mentorship, capacity building and Consultancy services in the following areas:

- NGO management and mentoring
- Proposal development
- Project development and management
- Cooperative group formation, development and services.
- Micro-credit scheme development and Implementation
- HIV/AIDS project Development and capacity building in HIV/AIDS components.
- Counseling and Communication Skills
- IEC / BCC material Development and production.
- Community social mobilization
- Sanitation and hygiene education / promotion.

INSTITUTIONAL CAPACITY BUILDING EFFORTS

To be able to achieve organizational objective, EDFHO operate six state offices, its headquarters is located at Ado-Ekiti, Ekiti State and branch offices at Akure, Ondo State, Benin City, Edo State, Kabba, Kogi State, Omuo - Aran, Kwara State and Birnin Kebbi, Kebbi state.

The six offices are staffed, equipped for office operations. The Ado- Ekiti head office has a Health and Youth friendly Resource Centre equipped in HIV/AIDS/STls, Reproductive Health and other Educational materials. The organization have completed and open its headquarter office building (EDFHO HOUSE) for use in April, 2013.

In area of personnel, the organization has built up its staff and members capacity in the following areas: Proposal Development; Project Management; Project Research, Monitoring and Evaluation skills; Advocacy skills, Trainers in HIV/AlDS/STls, Counseling and Communication Skills, BCC/IEC materials development, Cooperative group formations and Micro credit / Enterprises development scheme operations, community Mobilization, Sanitation and Hygiene Education. Its five years strategic plan (2013-2017) and resource mobilization plans are in place.

PERCEIVED STRENGTH OF ORGANISATION

The strength of EDFHO rest mostly on its members. It is a membership organization with reservoir of tested professionals who are drawn from academia, private and public sectors. They are seasoned, current and practicing professionals who have excelled in their chosen fields.

In addition, the organization has office spaces in Ekiti state (permanent owned office building), Ondo, Edo, Kogi and Kebbi States with trained personnel and a long standing and experienced Executive Director in NGO Management.

STAFFING

EDFHO currently have a total of 22 full-time employees and 1 part-time in its services. The full-time staffs are made up of sixteen (16) management and program staff and three (4) support staff. FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

In order to maintain a proper accounting system for purpose of accountability and transparency, EDFHO set up a financial management system {FMS} in line with best practices to render accurate and comprehensive account of funds from all sources and their subsequent uses.
